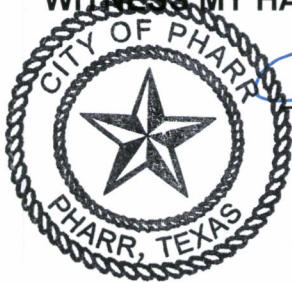

Crossings for the Pharr International Bridge totaled **89,679** vehicles for the month of April F.Y. 2021-2022, which showed a decrease of **(-9,461)** vehicles or **(-9.54%)** over the same month in F.Y. 2020-2021.

Car crossings for the Pharr International Bridge totaled **36,340** cars for the month of April F.Y. 2021 – 2022, showing a decrease of **(-4,402)** cars or **(-10.80%)** over the same month in F.Y. 2020 – 2021.

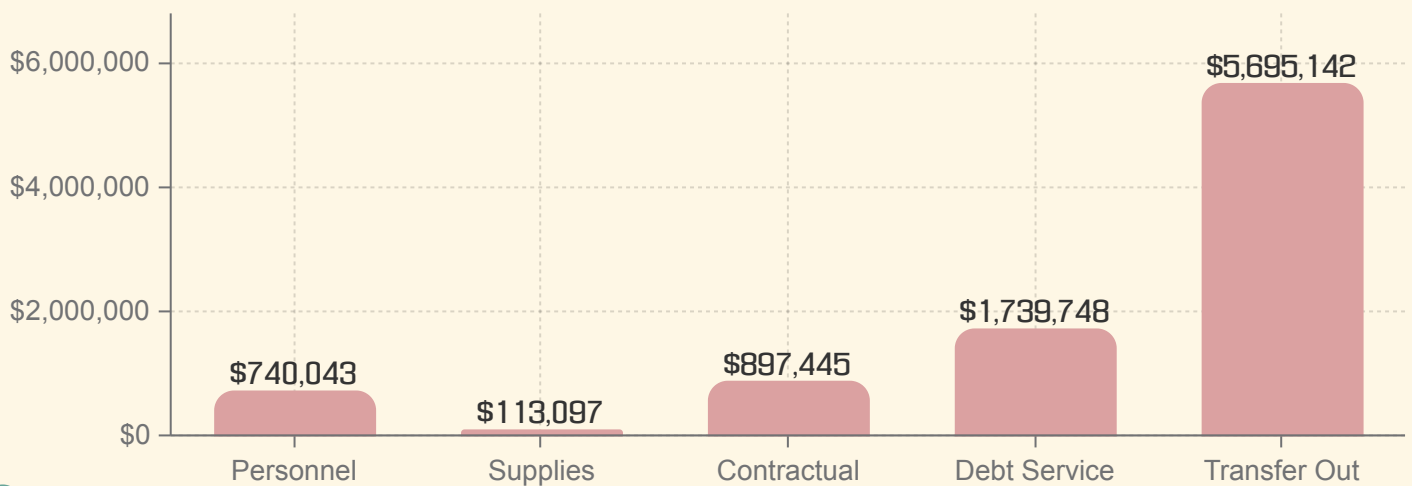

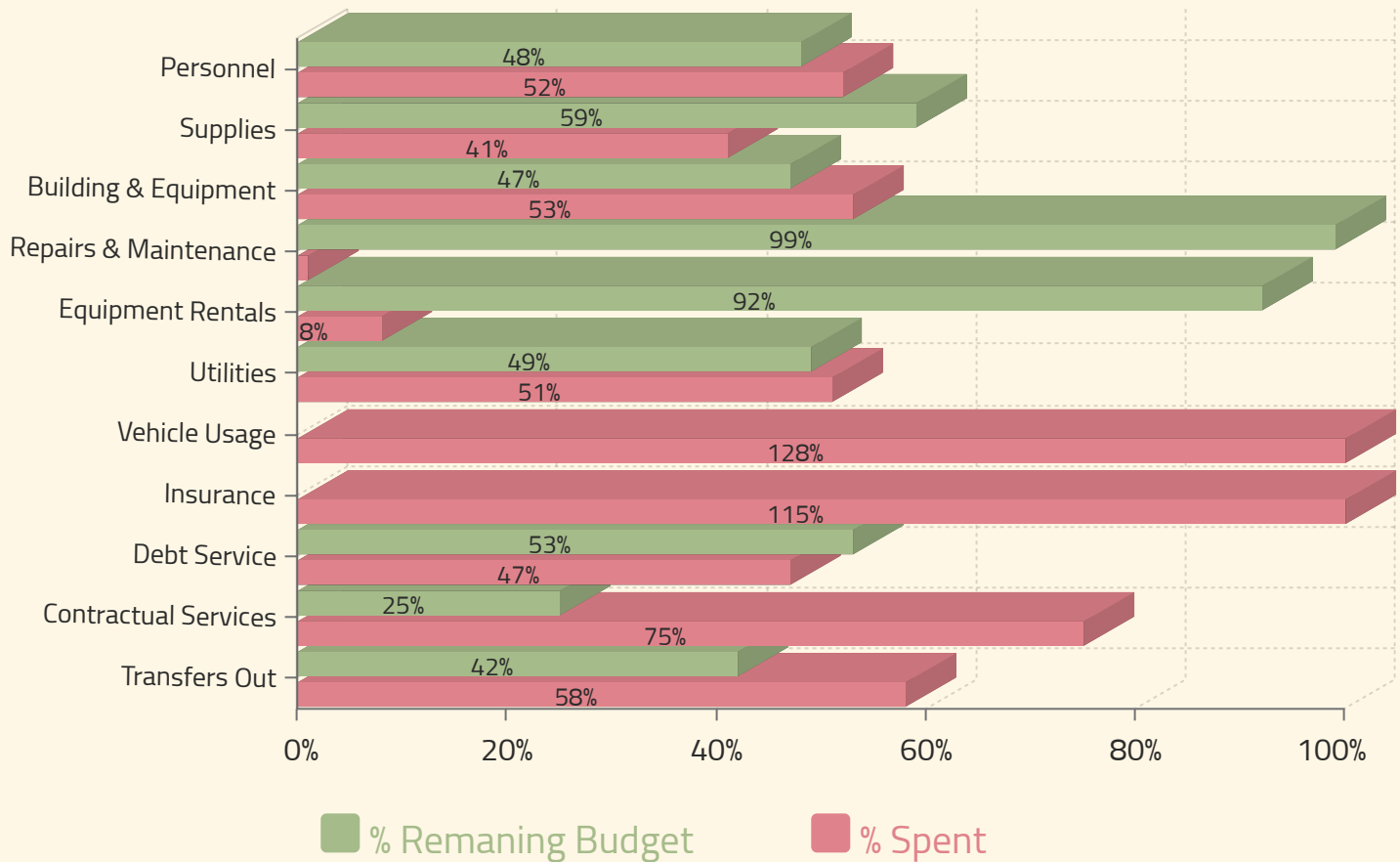

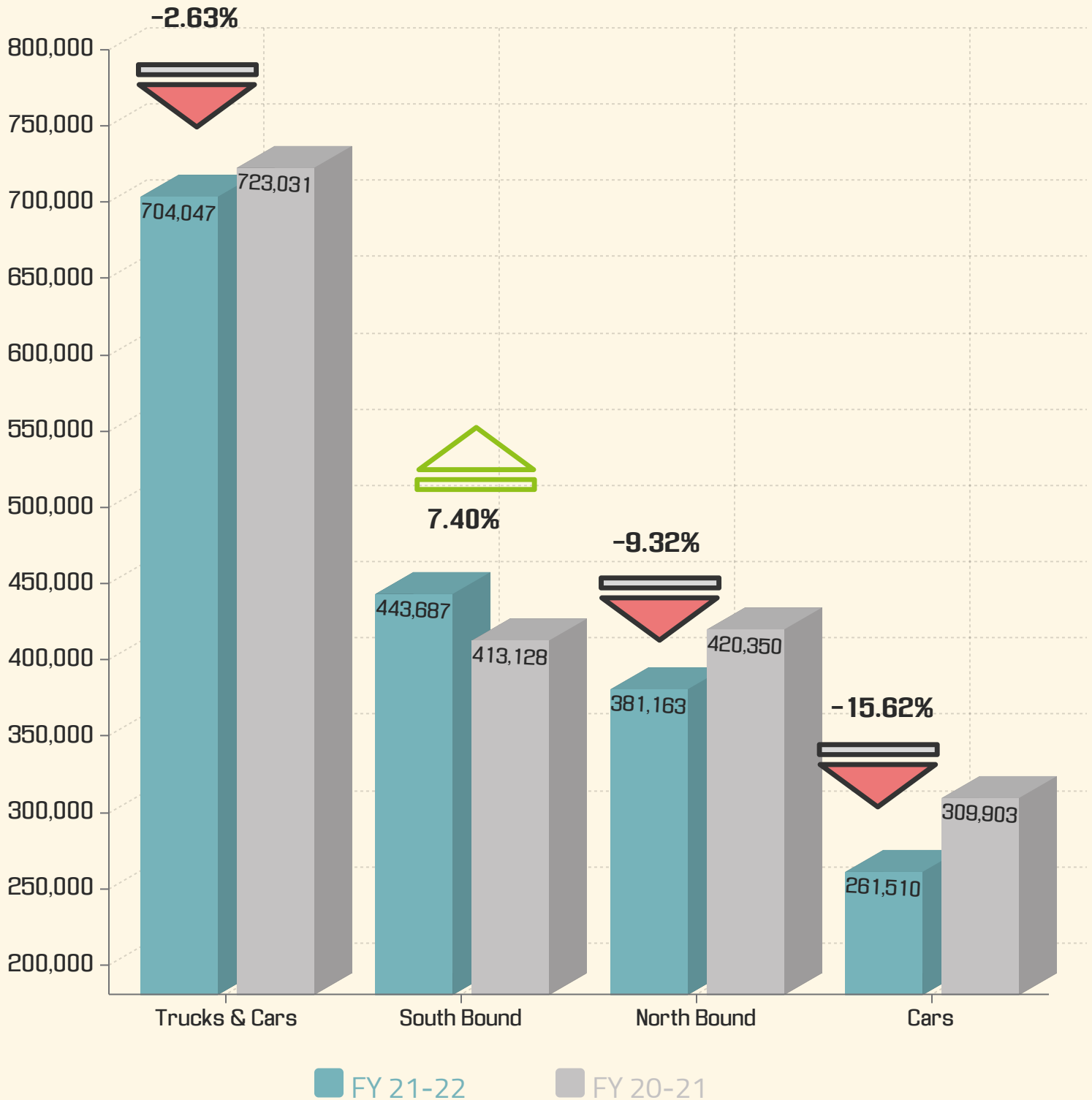

There being a quorum established Chairman Edgar Delgadillo called the meeting to order.

A. CALL TO ORDER:

ITEM 1 ROLL CALL-EXCUSE ABSENT MEMBERS

Chairman Delgadillo called the meeting to order. All members were present during roll call.

ITEM 2 PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATIONS

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, led in the Pledge of Allegiance and said the prayer.

B. DIRECTOR'S ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT: *(Director's Administrative Reports and discussion, if any, with Bridge Board. The Director may also assign a designated spokesperson for any particular listed topic)*

ITEM 3 CROSSING AND REVENUES COMPARISON FOR MARCH 2022

Chairman Edgar Delgadillo introduced the item.

Fred Brouwen, Director of Operations, went over the total crossings and revenues report for the month of March 2022. He reported total crossings were 108,546, which was a decrease of -3,021 vehicles or -2.71% compared to last year. Mr. Brouwen stated that total crossing for cars were 41,472, which was a decrease of -6,638 cars or -13.80% and showed a car crossing compassion from other bridges across the board. Mr. Brouwen further reported the total truck crossings were 67,074, which was an increase of 3,617 trucks or 5.70% increase. Mr. Brouwen then showed a truck crossing compassion from other bridges across the board. Mr. Brouwen further reported northbound crossings were 60,137, which was a decrease of -4,658 trucks or -7.19% increase. Mr. Brouwen further stated for the agriculture for the month of March they had 18,605 trucks, which represents a 31% of all imports from Mexico to the U.S. He also reported Northbound and Southbound combination of both crossings for the month of March were 127,211, which was a decrease of -1,041 or -0.81%. Mr. Brouwen stated total revenue collected for the month of March was \$1,561,510, which shows an increase of \$149,257 or 10.57% in revenues. Lastly, Mr. Brouwen reported on crossing comparison by axle and stated that cars and trucks were 41,471, 2X trucks were 3,186, 3X trucks were 4,524, 4X trucks were 1,692, 5X trucks were 52,650, 6X trucks 4,896, mobile homes were 1, wide loads were 86 and special crossings were 40 and total combination for the month of March was 108,546.

Discussions ensued on the crossings.

ITEM 4 FINANCE REPORT FOR MARCH 2022

Chairman Edgar Delgadillo introduced the item.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, stated Karla Saavedra, Finance Director, was in the audience and would give the board a quick report on the finances for the bridge.

Karla Saavedra, Finance Director, then began to give a quick report on the expenditures and revenues year to date for the bridge.

After several discussion, Chairman Edgar Delgadillo moved to the next item.

ITEM 5 PROJECT ENGINEER REPORT

Chairman Edgar Delgadillo introduced the item.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, stated Maria Rangel, Assistant City Engineer, was present and questions on projects could be entertained at this time.

Maria Rangel, Asst. City Engineer, reported on FY15. She stated time to date is 98% and amount placed to date is about 80%. She reported that on the northbound lane expansion the contractors are working on the installation of forms for the inspection booth foundations. She stated that on the 2nd BSIF Exit they have been working on the installation of the metal sheeting and roof panels on the canopy and on the concrete repair the concrete is being placed.

Maria Rangel, Asst. City Engineer, reported on FY16. She stated that 95% of the PS&E has been submitted to TX-DOT for review and should hear back from them at the end of April.

Maria Rangel, Asst. City Engineer, reported on the 2nd Span Project. She stated that the next step is to hold a public meeting which will take place on May 3rd here at city hall from 5:30-7:30pm and the public is welcomed to attend. She added that they will be submitting 30% PS&E to TX-DOT in May and are getting ready to submit batch 4 the final batch of the environmental technical reports which was delayed due to TX-DOT asking for additional requirements, so they are working on getting those submitted as soon as possible.

After several discussions, Chairman Edgar Delgadillo moved to the next item.

ITEM 6 DIRECTORS ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

He added that the training is to Become a Certified Customs Specialist and at this time he would like to call Mr. Juan Rabanales from SCT also accompanying him are Mr. Crispin Flores and Mrs. Meghan Roser both of the Mid-Valley Customs Brokers Association to talk more about this and some other courses that they will be offering.

Mr. Juan Rabanales from SCT then began his presentation regarding Certified Customs Specialist. Luis Bazan, Bridge Director then introduced Mr. Crispin Flores from C&J Logistical Services and past President of the Mid-Valley Customs Brokers Association to give a brief presentation as well. Several discussions then took place regarding the training.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, stated that on Thursday, April 28th they will be taking a deeper dive in to this at BridgeConnect with Mr. Rabanales and some of members from Mid-Valley Customs Brokers Association.

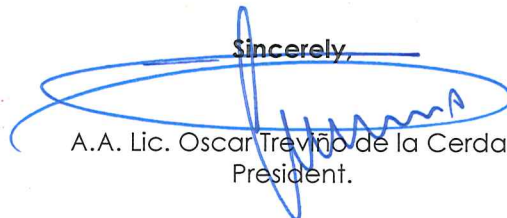
