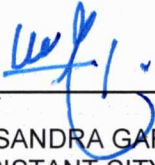

**CROSSINGS AND REVENUES
FOR THE MONTH OF MAY
FISCAL YEAR 2024 – 2025**

a) BRIDGE CROSSINGS

Crossings for the Pharr International Bridge totaled **105,646** vehicles for the month of May F.Y. 2024-2025, which showed a decrease of **(-1,908)** vehicles or **-1.77%** over the same month in F.Y. 2023-2024.

b) CAR CROSSINGS

Car crossings for the Pharr International Bridge totaled **48,173** cars for the month of May F.Y. 2024 – 2025, showing an increase of **944** cars or **2.00%** over the same month in F.Y. 2023 – 2024.

c) NORTHBOUND CAR CROSSINGS

Northbound Car crossings at the Pharr International Bridge totaled **49,911** cars for the month of May F.Y. 2024 – 2025, showing an increase of **9,344** cars or **23.03%** over the same month in F.Y. 2023 – 2024.

d) SOUTHBOUND TRUCK CROSSINGS

Truck crossings totaled **57,473** trucks for the month of May F.Y. 2024-2025, showing a decrease of **(-2,852)** trucks or **-4.73%** over the same month in F.Y. 2023 - 2024.

SOUTHBOUND TRUCK CROSSINGS SHOWED A DECREASE OF (-2,157) TRUCKS OR -3.62% FOR THE MONTH OF MAY, COMPARED TO NORTHBOUND TRUCK CROSSINGS.

e) NORTHBOUND TRUCKS

Northbound trucks at the Pharr International Bridge totaled **59,630** trucks for the month of May F.Y. 2024-2025, showing a decrease of **(-2,582)** trucks or **-4.15%** over the same month in F.Y. 2023-2024.

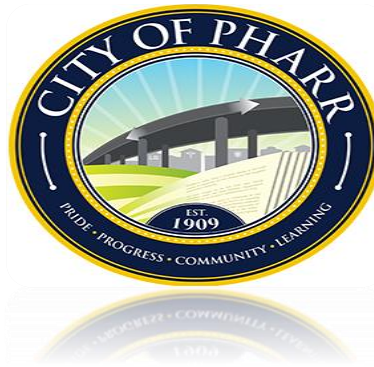

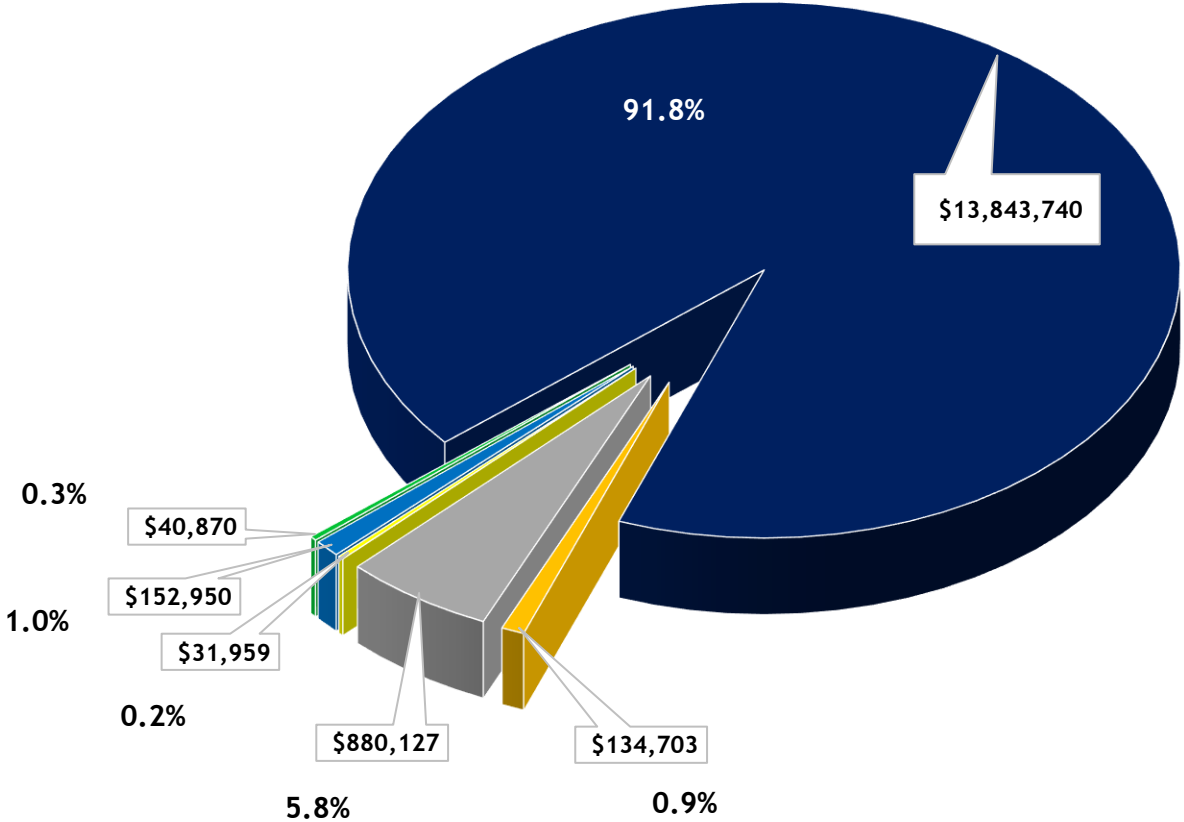

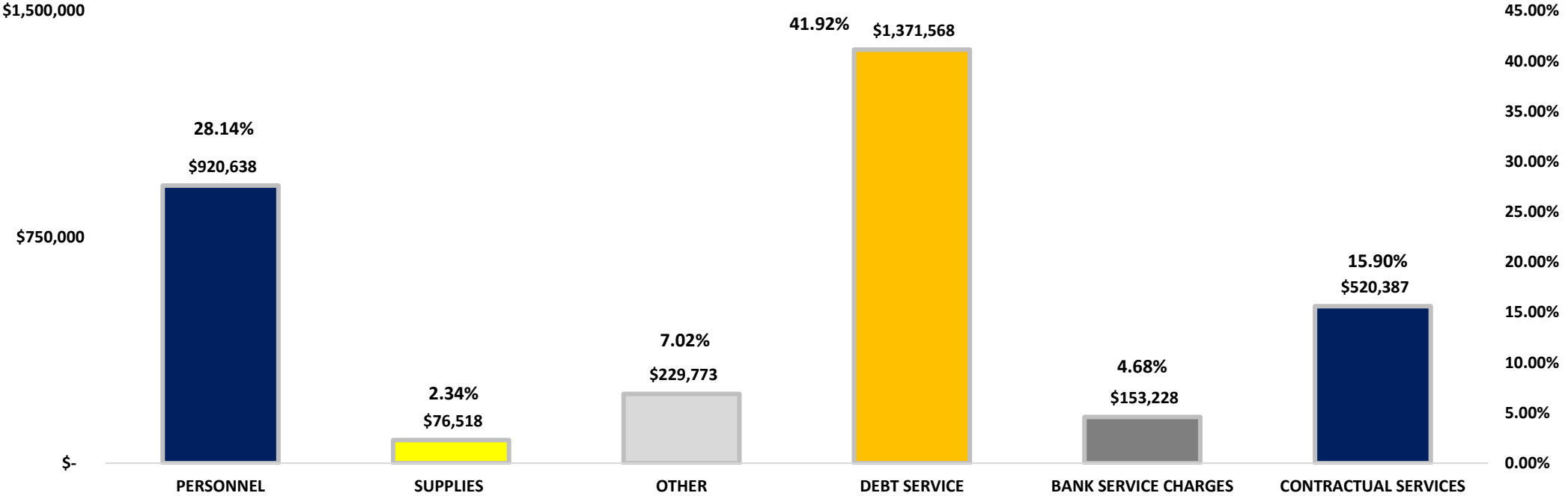

Total Operating Expenses

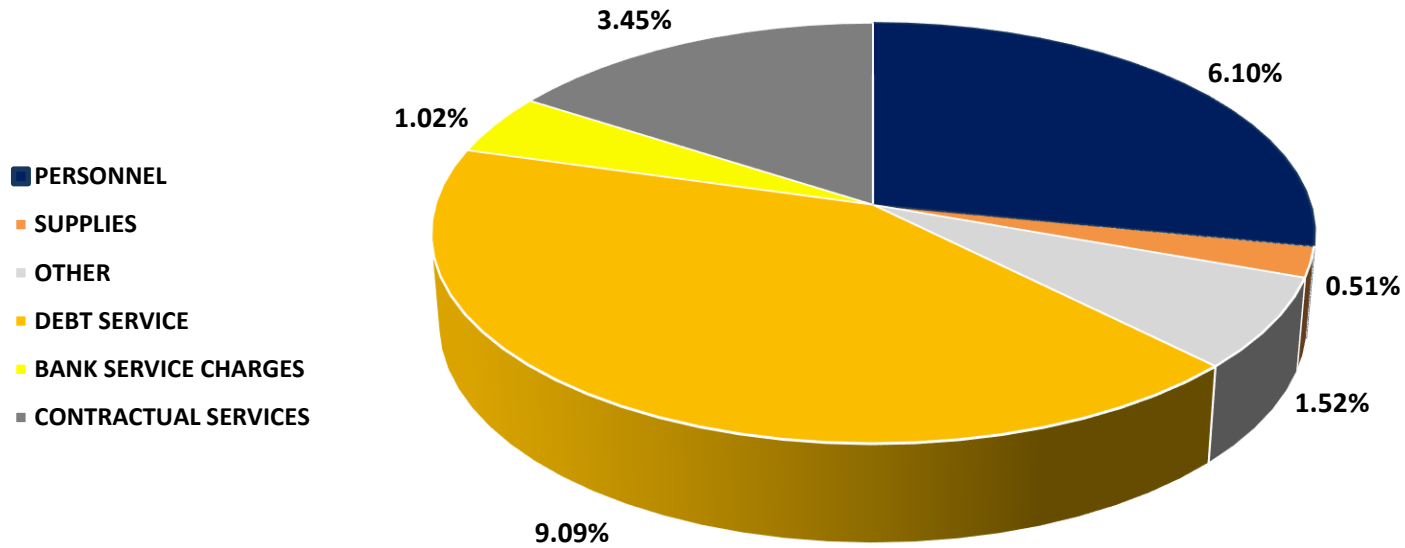

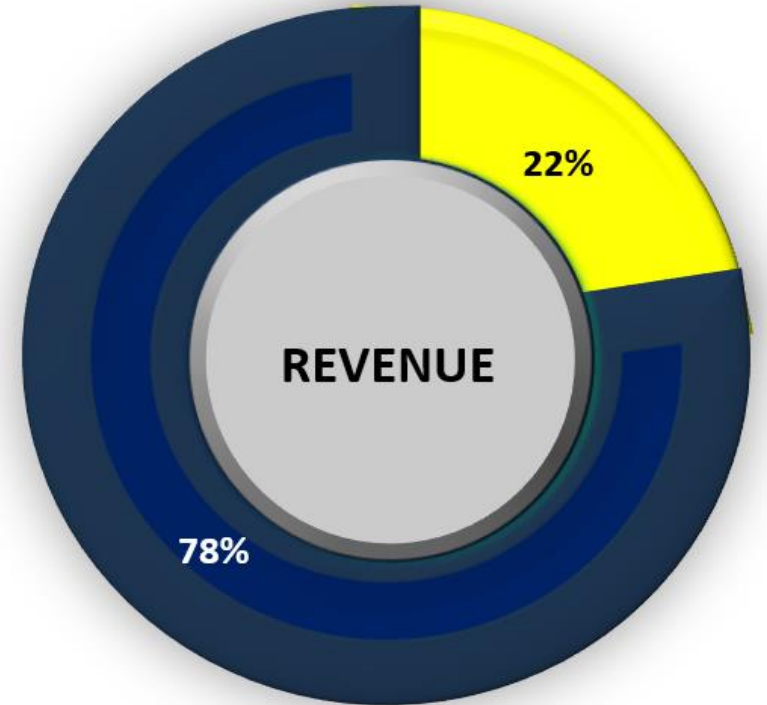
Operating Expenses



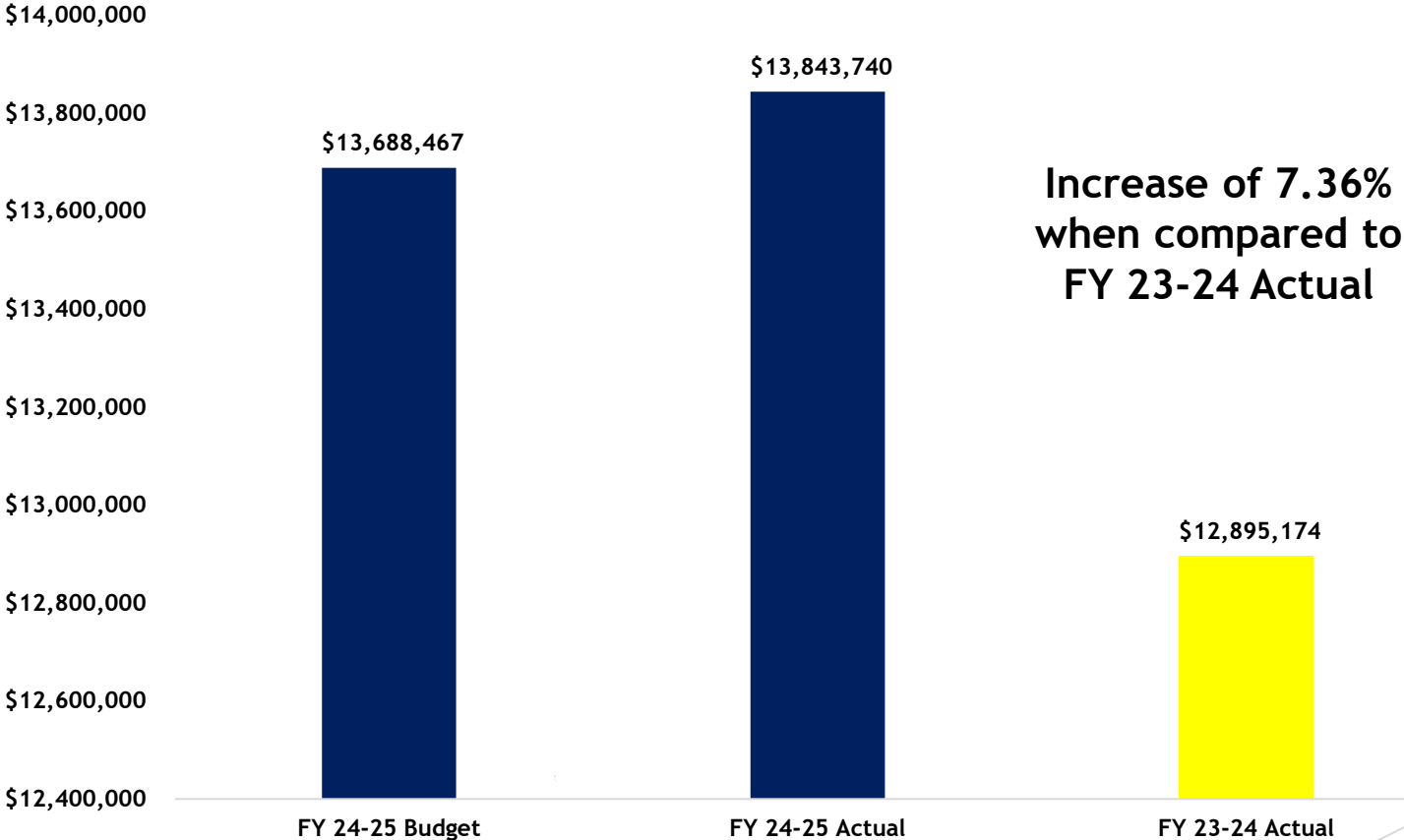
Operating Expenses As A Percentage of Revenues

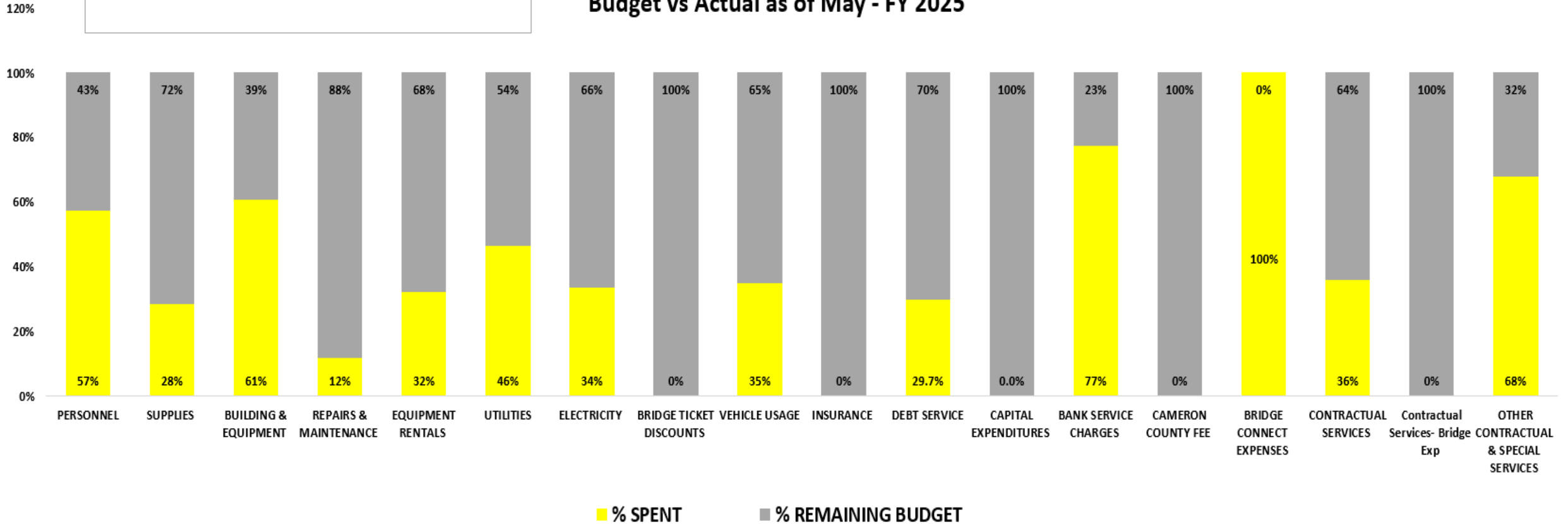

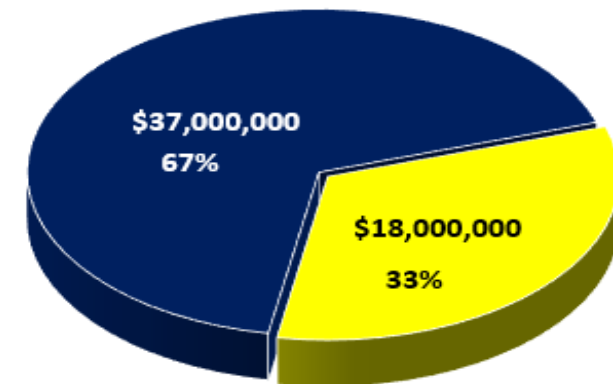

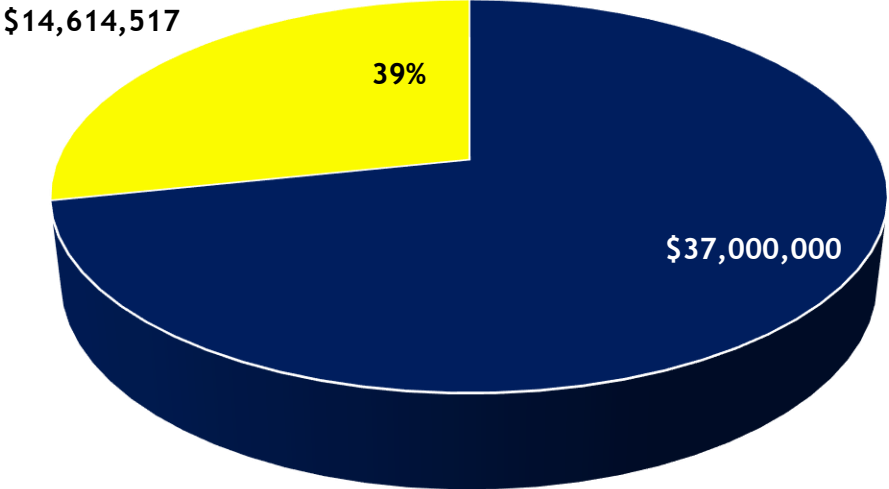


■ Bridge Expansion ■ DAP 16



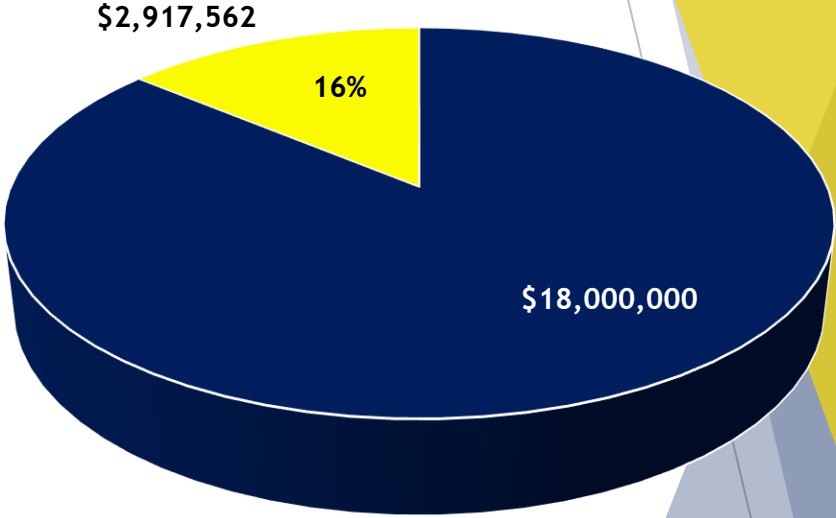
Bridge Bond Debt: YTD Funded Amount

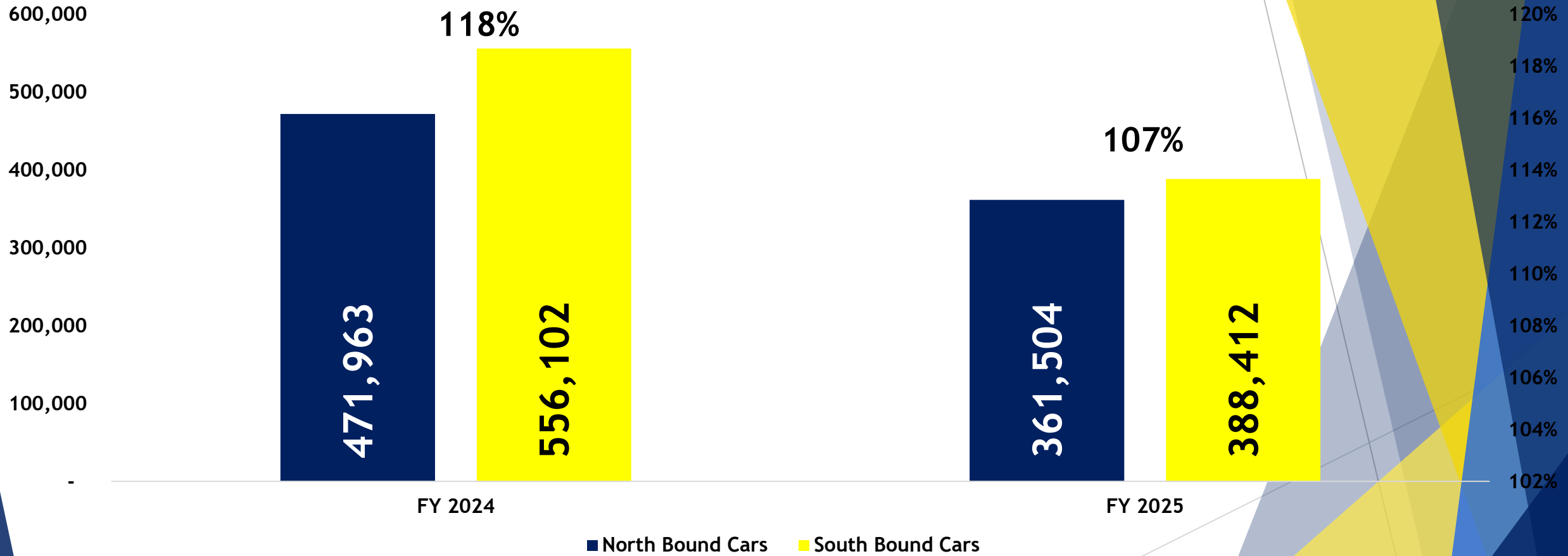

Southbound Recapture Rate

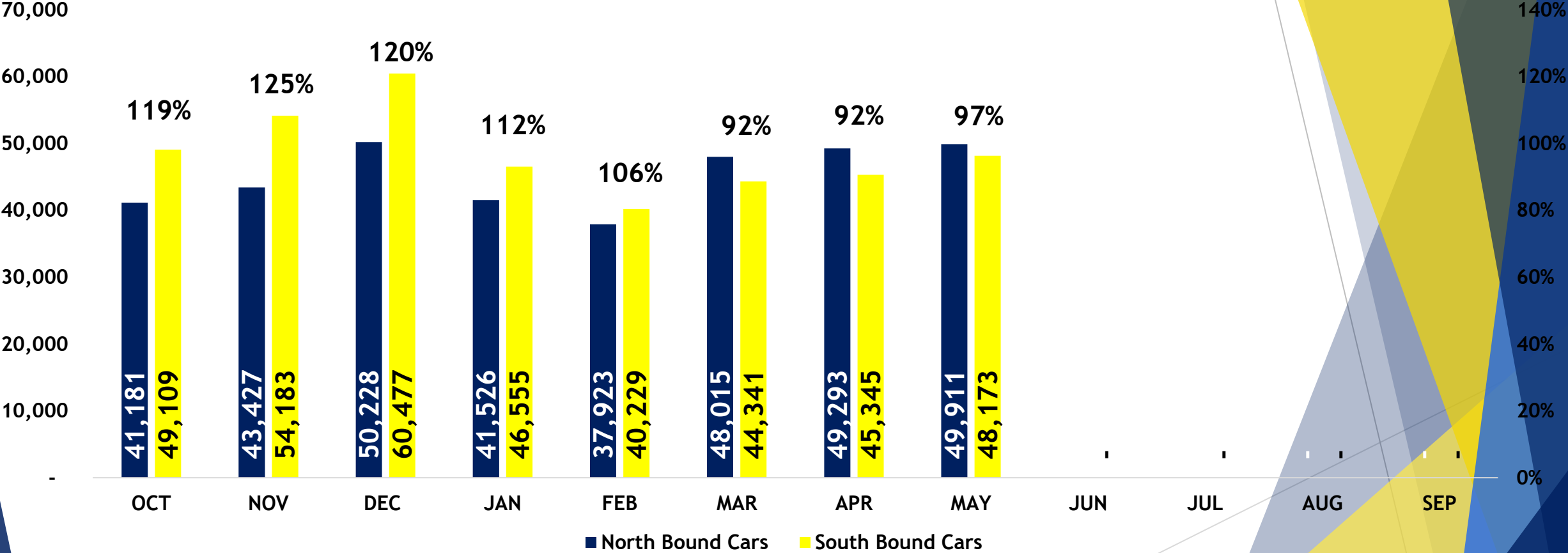
May - FY 2025



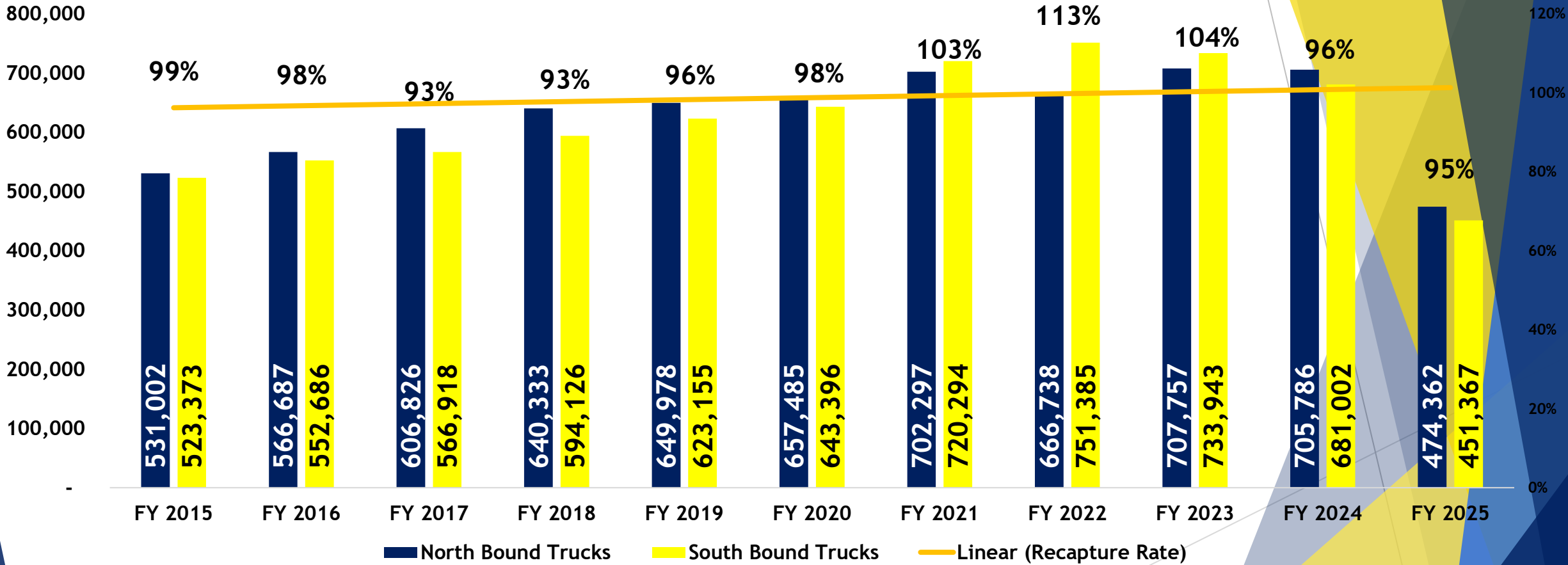
Historical Southbound Car Recapture Rate



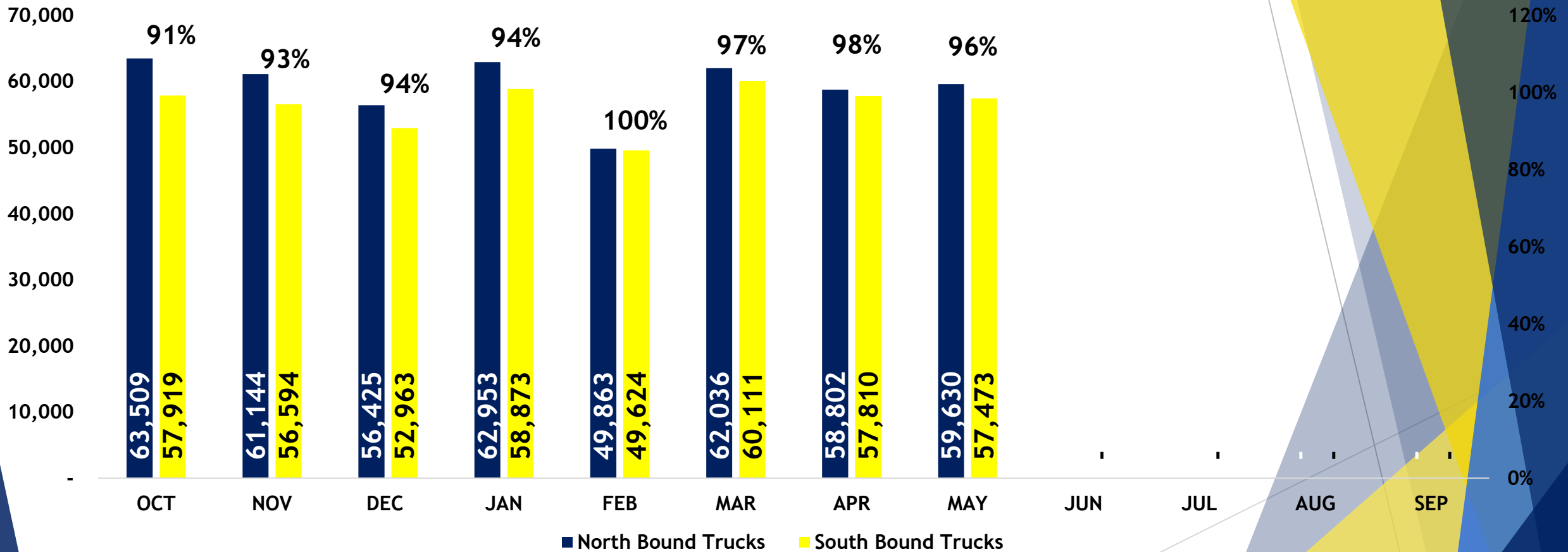
YTD Southbound Car Recapture Rate

ITEM 1. CALL TO ORDER

A) ROLL CALL AND POSSIBLE ACTION ON THE EXCUSING OF ANY ABSENT MEMBER

Chairman Edgar Delgadillo called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. Roll call established a quorum.

Vice-Chairman Tony Martinez moved to excuse absent members. Member Lazaro Beas seconded the motion and when put to a vote, it carried unanimously.

B) PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE/INVOCATION

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, led in the pledge of allegiance and said the invocation.

ITEM 2. DIRECTOR'S ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT

A) CROSSING AND REVENUES REPORT FOR MARCH 2025

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director introduced the item.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, went over the total crossings and revenues report for the month of March 2025. He reported total crossings for the month of March were 104,452, which was an increase of 1,071 vehicles or 1.04% compared to last year. Mr. Bazan further reported total car crossings for the month of March were 44,341, which was a decrease of -2,795 cars or -5.93%. He also reported northbound car crossings for the month of March 2025 were 48,015, which was an increase of 6,205 cars or 14.84% and went over car crossing comparisons from other bridges for the month of April 2025.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, reported on the total truck crossings for the month of March 2025. He stated crossings were 60,111, which was an increase of 3,866 trucks or 6.87% increase and went over truck crossings comparisons from other bridges for the month of March 2025.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, also reported northbound crossings for the month of March 2025 were 62,036, which was an increase of 3,917 trucks or 6.74% increase and stated the agriculture for the month of March 2025 had 21,261 trucks, which represents 34% of all imports from Mexico to the U.S. He further reported on combination of northbound and southbound truck crossings for the month of March 2025 were 122,147, which was an increase of 7,783 or 6.81%.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, went over the crossing comparisons by axle for the month of March 2025. He stated cars were 44,341, 2X trucks were 2,676, 3X trucks were 5,333, 4X trucks were 1,031, 5X trucks were 45,343, 6X trucks were 249, mobile homes were 0, and wide loads were 128. He stated special crossings were 5,351 and the total combination for the month of March was 104,452.

Lastly, Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, reported on total revenues collected for the month of March 2025. He reported the total revenues collected for the month were \$1,824,299, which showed an increase of \$103,531 or 6.02% in revenues.

B) FINANCE REPORT FOR MARCH 2025

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director introduced the item.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, called upon Eddie Gutierrez, Bridge Financial Consultant, for the March 2025 finance report.

Eddie Gutierrez, Bridge Financial Consultant with Blue Stone Capital Solutions, briefly reported on the expenditures and revenues year- to- date for the bridge. He also reported on F.Y. 2024-2025 2nd Quarter Crossings & Revenues Comparison.

C) ENGINEER'S REPORT

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director introduced the item.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, stated Maria Rangel, City Engineer, was present and questions on projects could be entertained at this time.

Maria Rangel, City Engineer, reported on the DAP FY16 project. She stated they were moving forward with project and reported a delay of eight (8) days due to the rainstorm. She also stated they would be receiving an updated schedule from the contractor on the project and the twin span bridge. She further reported that before the rain, the contractor was working on the electrical ducts and the building pads. She stated regarding payment, they were about 5%, and they did receive pay app #4 for an additional two million dollars, and were about one hundred one (101) days or 23.8% into the contract time.

Maria Rangel, City Engineer, reported on the 2nd Span Project. She stated they brought in the precast bent caps from the San Antonio area, which connect the columns, and they installed thirteen (13) of them before the rain started. She added that now that the area is safe to work, they started this week to continue installing the precast bent and are installing six (6) per day. She stated the drilled shafts were 80% complete and the columns were 70% complete. She further reported they were 45% into the contract and had paid out approximately 30% of the contract.

Lastly, Maria Rangel, City Engineer, reported on the Commercial Vehicle Parking Area. She stated she would be providing a revised schedule, but is currently in talks with Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) because they might be adding some components to the construction, which may change the bid opening date and the construction date.

Discussion ensued on the engineer's report.

D) DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director introduced the item.

Luis Bazan, Bridge Director, reported on Viva Fresh Expo. He stated they have been members of Texas International Produce Association for over ten years and have been sponsoring their regional conference Viva Fresh and this was the second year that the media department had joined them and has done a great job in documenting the event and that video would be posted on social media but first would be presented at the city commission. He added that they had part of the team there representing the Pharr Bridge and were able to interact with current and potential customers.

Discussion ensued on the Viva Fresh Expo.
